SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME

The program of the Symposium will include plenary and keynote lectures as well as posters. Oral and poster contributions will be regarded as scientifically equivalent in the program. Special focus will be devoted to the brief presentation of selected posters of original papers in full audience sessions.

The following sessions are scheduled:

Session I	Atmospheric chemistry – climate change as related to the Mediterranean area – urban air, indoor environment and human exposure to pollutants
Session II	Pathways and effects of chemicals in terrestrial, aquatic and marine ecosystems – ecotoxicology and radioactivity in water, soil and sediments – remediation of soil and evalua- tion of water quality
Session III	Biological and chemical methods for environmental control and risk assessment of chemical substances – ecotoxicologi- cal safety of new chemicals
Session IV	Technologies for treatment and recycling of wastes – waste disposal – oxidation and removal processes
Session V	Environmental policy, regulations, harmonisation and imple- mentation – integrated, holistic approaches: to bridge the gap between research and decision making – from data to concrete policy relevant information – environmental law and environmental education

Each topic will be introduced by an invited keynote lecture (30 min.) followed by selected volunteered oral presentations (20 min. each, including the time for discussion). A slide, an overhead, and a powerpoint projector will be available. All presentations (oral and posters) will be in English.

Special focus will be devoted to the presentation of posters of original papers which will be displayed in a separate room. The sizes of the display boards will be 1 m wide by 1,2 m high. No parallel sessions are envisaged.

ABSTRACTS

For both oral and poster contributions, a one-page abstract should be submitted to MESAEP **before June 10th**, **2001**.

Use Times New Roman 12 font, type single spaced, keep all margins 2,5 cm. Title should be typed in capitals and bold. Author(s) initials and last name (no title nor degree). Underline name of presenter if more than one author. Full address of institution. Centre title, author's name and address. Single space between title and author(s) name, single space between name and institution and double space between address and abstract text. Abstract text should be justified (flush left and right), all paragraphs separated by one Hard Return. Please, make effort to use all the space of the sheet (15 cm x 24,5 cm).

If abstract is accepted for oral presentations, the communicating author, who will also be the presenting speaker, will accordingly notified by July 10th, 2001. Abstract not selected for oral presentation will be considered for poster display and notified by July 10th, 2001.
