Previous symposia were held in Athens, Greece (1981), Crete, Greece (1983), Istanbul, Turkey (1985), Kavala, Greece (1987), Blanes, Spain (1989), Como, Italy (1991), Antibes, France (1993), Rhodes, Greece (1995), Sorrento, Italy (1997), Alicante, Spain (1999), Limassol, Cyprus (2001), Antalya, Turkey (2003) and Thessaloniki, Greece (2005).

The Executive Committee of MESAEP, the Steering and the National Organizing Committees have the pleasure to forward this invitation to attend the 14th International MESAEP Symposium that will be held in Seville, Spain from October 10 to 14, 2007.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the symposium are to provide opportunities for scientists of different countries to:

- exchange recent results related to the processes of environmental pollution and its effects on public health in the Mediterranean region
- discuss current technological and legal measures to avoid or reduce the degradation of the environment
- present suggestions and recommendations to the regulatory authorities on environmental quality and safety in the Mediterranean and other neighbouring countries.

Human health is a major consideration of the EU Environmental Action Plan, and a major driver for policy in relation to environment. Environmental health effects are a significant part of the total disease burden even in developed countries. According to the World Health Organisation (WHO) circa 25-33% of the total burden of disease in industrialized countries can be attributed to environmental factors such as outdoor and indoor air pollution, inadequate water and sanitation, lead exposure, and injuries. The magnitude of burden varies among countries, but in almost all cases, the burden of disease was much higher in eastern and southeastern Europe due to a combination of climatic and socio-economic conditions, lifestyle and diet, as well as environmental quality.

This year's symposium will focus on the interconnections between the quality of the environment and human health in the Mediterranean region attempting to provide a comprehensive picture of the relative environmental burden and to elucidate the mechanisms through which environmental condition affects the state of human health. Particular attention will be paid to exposure and health effects of vulnerable population groups, such as children and women in child-bearing age. Papers reporting on results of environmental and biomonitoring, epidemiological analyses and the impact of health risk modifiers such as diet, age and lifestyle are particularly welcome. In addition, more conventional issues in environmental science, technology and management will be addressed contributing thus to improving our understanding of the state of the environment in the Mediterranean.

ORAL & POSTER PRESENTATIONS

The program of the symposium will include plenary and keynote lectures, voluntary oral presentations as well as posters. Oral and poster contributions will be regarded as scientifically equivalent in the program. Special focus will be devoted to the brief presentation of posters of original papers in full audience sessions. All presentations (oral and posters) should be in English.

PAPERS PUBLICATION

For both oral and poster contributions, a one-page abstract should be submitted to the Mailing Address reported below not later than May 15, 2007.

The book of abstracts will be distributed to all participants upon registration at the Symposium.

Poster or lecture will be accepted if at least one of the authors is registered and present at the symposium for personal communication.

The Steering Committee of the Symposium will notify the authors on the acceptance and on the form of presentation by June 30, 2007.

All papers presented at the symposium will be eligible, upon refereeing, for publication in the peer-reviewed international journal FRESINIUS ENVIRONMENTAL BULLETIN (FEB), the official journal of MESAEP.

SYMPOSIUM LOCATION

Seville is located in the South of Spain. A provincial capital, seat of the government and parliament of the Comunidad Autónoma de Andalucía (Regional Government). It has around one million inhabitants. The city of Seville is located on the plain of the Guadalquivir river which crosses the city from North to South. The river can be navigated from Seville all the way to its outlet near Sanlúcar de Barrameda, on the Atlantic coast.

In the past the port of Seville played an important role in commerce between Spain and the Americas and it remains today one of the most active river ports of the European Union. Painters such as Velázquez, Murillo and Valdés Leal, and sculptors like Martínez Montañés were born in Seville and left behind important works. The city also assumed an important role in world literature and was the birthplace of the myth of Don Juan, and operas like Carmen, Figaro, Il barbiere di Siviglia, Don Giovanni, etc.
